



Application form for approval of providers of alternative hygiene training at basic level

The application form is to be sent to the Danish Veterinary and Food Administration, Division for Microbiological Food Safety, Hygiene and Zoonosis Control, Mørkhøj Bygade 19, DK-2860 Søborg, Denmark. Submission can also be done through this portal.

Approval of the course is sought as an alternative to training programmes offered under Labour Market Training (AMU) auspices.

Requirements for hygiene training at basic level

The hygiene training programme must comprise at least six hours of actual instruction, excluding breaks.

The training must cover the following topics:

- Self-inspection, including critical control points and monitoring procedures
- General microbiology, including food-borne diseases.
- Principles of hygiene, including cleaning, personal hygiene and handling and storage of food
- Food legislation and the function of the regional food administration control centres

Requirements for instructors

The instructors used by the training establishment must have completed training in food science as a process technologist, food technician or at an equivalent or higher level. Instructors must also have at least three years of relevant professional experience.

Attestation of competence

Once the examination has been passed, an attestation of competence will be issued containing information on the training programme, the training establishment and the name of the participant.

Time-limited approval

The approval is limited in time to three years. The approval lapses automatically after three years, unless the training establishment has had its approval extended before the three-year period expires.

Revocation of approval

The training establishment must inform the Danish Veterinary and Food Administration if the conditions for approval are no longer met.

The approval may be revoked if the conditions for approval are no longer met, or if there are repeated or serious shortcomings in the quality of the training.

Rules and guidelines

The requirements to be met by the training establishment are laid down in the “Executive Order on Training in Food Hygiene”¹ and described in the “Guidelines on approval of advisors and alternative providers of hygiene training at certificate level for cases relating to mandatory advice and training” and the “Guidelines for training”.

The undersigned hereby declares that he or she has read the above guidelines and that he or she will in all respects comply with the requirements of the “Executive Order on Training in Food Hygiene”.
